### **CANBERRA TRIP**

Earlier this year the Year 12 Legal Studies classes together with the Year 12 History class attended a trip in Canberra where we visited the sights and took part in educational programs that supported the curriculum and enhanced the students learning experience. Our students visited The National Gallery of Australia to see the Renaissance exhibition as well as visiting the High Court of Australia, Parliament House, the Australian Electoral Commission and Government House. Last term the newsletter featured photos and a detailed student account of the experience. The students who attended enjoyed their time in Canberra and thought it a valuable experience.

One of our goals is to keep the trip at an affordable cost to students so they can participate in this trip. This would not be possible without the assistance of the Australian Government. The Australian Government recognizes the importance of all young Australians being able to visit their National Capital as part of their civics and citizenship education. To assist in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian contributed funding of \$30 per eligible student which is provided under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program toward the travel expenses. This contribution will be paid directly to the school now that the excursion is completed.

We would like to acknowledge and thank the Australian Government for their assistance and support of this program.
