Message from Campus Principal

Hello Everyone.

Sorry for the delay in getting this newsletter out. It was meant to be done on Friday but then everything changed dramatically around lunch time. I was going to tell you that the year has started smoothly and it was great to be back to normal face to face classes. Students have settled in well and are showing that they are learning and adapting to the different demands of the senior campus. And now we are in lockdown.

You should have all received a message around what to expect for Monday – Wednesday this week. The predicted short time away from school and the very short notice that teachers received means that for this week, work for students will be uploaded on the TEAMS account for each subject. Contact with teachers can be made through TEAMS either by the subject account or the University Students and Staff account. This second account will also allow contact with non-teacher advocates, counsellors and support staff and me.

Hopefully we will be back to face to face classes on Thursday. If the lockdown is extended then we will return to the model that was used last year where we followed the normal timetable with classes running at their scheduled times.

- VCE and VCAL students doing VET courses will have to follow the directions sent out by the different VET providers.

- For students on work placement on Wednesday do not go to your employer for this day. VCAL teachers will let you know what is happening for students with work placement on Friday.

A number of students were quite upset when they found out that we were returning to lockdown. Many of these students were spoken to on Friday afternoon and advocates will be checking in with them. If you can see that your student is stressed by this lockdown please contact the school and let us know.

The school is open for students whose parents are **essential workers** or who need to be at school because they struggle when working from home. Only very limited staff will be at school so the process to access class work and teachers will be the same.

If you have any questions or concerns please contact me at school on 5132 3800. All our calls are being diverted to Morwell Campus, but the staff there will get the message through to me and I will call you back.

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund Applications

The CSEF helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amount this year is \$225 for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances **or you have enrolled as a new student to the school.**

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 5132 3800 and ask for an application form.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's CSEF web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

Applications close 18/6/2021.

School Council Election 2021 – Open 17 February

Kurnai College School Council Elections will open on **February 17** and we ask that you consider being involved.

[What is a school council and what does it do?](#)

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the school council?

For most school councils, there are four possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected **Parent category** - more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school.
- A mandated elected **DET employee category** - members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- A mandated elected **Student member category** – members of this category are enrolled at the school and in Year 7 or above.
- An optional **Community member category** - members are coopted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is Parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

How can you become involved?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might seriously consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

Do I need special experience to be on school council?

No. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future. Members over the age of 18 will require to provide a current Working with Children's Card.

Why is Student membership so important?

Students have a unique perspective on learning, teaching and schooling. Electing Student members onto school council allows all students to have a say in the future direction of their school and ensures student input into decision making.

Student representation on school councils assists in the development of students' skills, including leadership, skills, and communication skills.

Does my child need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role. However, councillors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them in order to perform their duties as a councillor.

Student members are encouraged to attend the Department's free face-to-face Improving School Governance school council training to support them to undertake their role. Training is also available online.

What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual time line has been varied by the Minister.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent / Student / DET category.

DET employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year. Be sure to vote in the elections.
