Parent Opinion Survey

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. Each year the school conducts an opinion survey amongst a sample of the school community. This year all parents are invited to participate.

The survey is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Information on how to complete the survey has been posted on Compass. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 20th October** to **Friday 13th November 2020**. All responses to the survey are anonymous.

Over the last two weeks I have responded to a number of concerned parents about the progress of their children since returning from remote learning. We have been reinforcing with students the need to make their best efforts at this time. You will have access to your child's most recent learning behaviour report now and it is important that you review this and contact teachers where concerns are being raised about your child's efforts towards their learning. The Year 7/8 Team will be reviewing those students who are struggling in multiple classes and making contact to seek family support to get students back on track.

Celebration Day

The Year 7/8 Team is keen to give students an opportunity for an overnight activity to finish up and celebrate their year in lieu of the camps that they have missed during lockdown in recent months. Students voiced their interest in this approach and with restrictions easing around regional Victorian schools and camps we are able to put this into action. Permission and details will come out soon, but we will offer this at no cost to students, with the overnight activity occurring on Thursday, 3rd December, finishing in the morning on Friday, 4th December and with no classes or activities for the students during the day on Friday, 4th December.

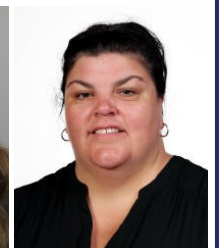
