legendary at Churchill.






2020 Grade 6 Orientation Visits?

Academy of Enterprising Girls

On Thursday 26th November all the Year 8 girls will be participating in the Young Change Agents program

called the Academy of Enterprising Girls. The Young Change Agents is a not for profit social enterprise focused on developing the mindset, skillset and toolset of youth aged 10 - 21. The Young Change Agents are equipping young people for their future careers and empowering them to create their own pathways.

The program is being delivered through online pre-recorded videos and live facilitation via video calls and online engagement platform.

The program focuses on identifying a problem within the local community and developing a prototype which is pitched to an audience at the end of the day.

The girls will go through the process of working through design thinking stages, problem solving, working with hypothetical customers and creating a prototype product which is uploaded for appraisal at the end of the day.


ARE YOU ABLE TO DONATE YOUR SCHOOL UNIFORM TO THE SCHOOL?


