## Message from our Campus Principal

As we kick off the “term that is like no other”, I am really pleased with the effort that teachers, support staff and students are putting in to make the most of difficult circumstances.

I know that some families are still struggling with connectivity and other tech issues. We are doing our best to develop work around for these and hope to be able to provide internet connections and additional data to families needing it very soon.

As I talk to various teachers each day, I am hearing some fantastic stories about innovative things that students are doing at home to demonstrate their learning.

A Year 7 music student wrote a short rhythm and recorded himself performing it on items from the kitchen cupboard.

A number of Year 8's have a group chat that they log into each day to work collaboratively on their learning tasks. They help each other, brain-storm, and problem solve.

The Learning Task this week in Year 8 Science has involved the students recreating the Particle Model using objects around their home. We have already had Particle Models re-created in Minecraft, as well as a representation using cereal to show the individual particles. We have also seen the particle model represented by sprinkles on pieces of cake.

As you can see, many of our students are really stepping up to the task of using the resources they have around them. Some of the learning done at this time will be more powerful than any other, because students are being required to be so much more resourceful than usual.

This might be different to how other schools are recording students' attendance.


### LEARNING TASKS

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
## Year 7 & 8 News

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

## Year 10 News



## CSEF

Due to COVID-19, you may now be eligible for Camps Sports Excursion Fund (CSEF). To be eligible you must be one of the following:

1. a parent/carer (of the relevant student) who is:

- on the first day of term one or the first day of term two an eligible beneficiary of either a Centrelink Health Care Card or a Pensioner Concession Card; or
- an eligible beneficiary of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card; or

2. a temporary foster carer; or

3. the parent/carer of a student who is 16 years or older and who holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card or Disability Support Pension Card).

The parent/carer must submit an application to the school prior to the end of Term 2.

Provided the above conditions are satisfied, the amount payable is:

- \$225 for secondary school students.

If you have already applied for this earlier, you do not need to do anything as you have already received your CSEF; however for those that may now be eligible please contact the school to get your application form in or use the link below before the end of Term 2.
