Message from our Campus Principal



REMOTE LEARNING

As the fourth week of remote learning draws to a close, I would like to pay tribute to all the families who are supporting their students to complete on-line lessons, even though they themselves are struggling to balance working from home or other impacts on their lives at this difficult time. We appreciate the efforts you are making to help us support your children.

I was interested to read the views of Professor John Hattie, an esteemed educator whose work has shaped many of the improvement strategies at Kurnai College, on the impacts of distance learning in Victoria.

While he has not directly studied the impact of extended school closures, he makes the very important point that schools in Australia and America have MUCH longer school days than some other countries. Taking a term (about 10 weeks) out of an Australian school year still gives students more face to face time than students in countries like Finland, Korea and Sweden, all of which outscore Australia in literacy and numeracy tests.

BUILDING UPDATE

While so many other things are grinding to a halt, it is pleasing to see our building project proceeding well. The last of the old classrooms in the courtyard are now gone, the new library has been surveyed, and earth works have started ready for in-ground plumbing to be installed. In the next couple of weeks, we are expecting the slab to be laid and steel starting to be put up.

MORWELL CAMPUS - PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

CSEF

Due to COVID-19, you may now be eligible for Camps Sports Excursion Fund (CSEF). To be eligible you must be one of the following:

- 1. a parent/carer (of the relevant student) who is:
- on the first day of term one or the first day of term two an eligible beneficiary of either a Centrelink Health Care Card or a Pensioner Concession Card; or
- an eligible beneficiary of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card; or
- 2. a temporary foster carer; or
- 3. the parent/carer of a student who is 16 years or older and who holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card or Disability Support Pension Card).

The parent/carer must submit an application to the school prior to the end of Term 2.

Provided the above conditions are satisfied, the amount payable is:

• \$225 for secondary school students.

If you have already applied for this earlier, you do not need to do anything as you have already received your CSEF; however for those that may now be eligible please contact the school to get your application form in or use the link below before the end of Term 2.
