Message from our Campus Principal

CARE AND SUPERVISION PROGRAM

Just a reminder to parents and carers that until the official return to onsite learning on Tuesday 9th June (Years 7 – 10), students who CAN learn from home MUST learn from home. If your circumstances have changed, ie parent or carer has returned to work, families can apply for their child to be supervised at school. Please contact the general office for a form or check on Compass.

RETURN TO SCHOOL PROCESSES

As we know more, we will endeavour to keep parents and carers as informed as possible.

Meanwhile, we ask that adults continue to socially distance themselves. Please do not congregate outside the school when dropping off or picking up your students. Unless absolutely essential, do not come onto school grounds for any purpose. If you must come into the school, please respect others' personal space, and limit numbers in the foyer.

YEAR 10 VCE STUDENTS

All Morwell Campus students studying a VCE unit must return to their onsite classes for VCE ONLY.

Buses will run from the front of the campus on Monday and Thursday afternoons at approximately 1:00pm. Students will need to be checked onto the bus in the usual way. Students will then return to Morwell on their normal Town Bus.

On Friday mornings, students need to catch the usual Town Bus out to Churchill. They will then return to the front of Morwell Campus on the school-provided bus as normal.

Please note that these students MUST NOT enter the Morwell Campus school grounds unless it is to access the bike shed.


Year 10 News

MORWELL CAMPUS - PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

CSEF

Due to COVID-19, you may now be eligible for Camps Sports Excursion Fund (CSEF). To be eligible you must be one of the following:

- 1. a parent/carer (of the relevant student) who is:
- on the first day of term one or the first day of term two an eligible beneficiary of either a Centrelink Health Care Card or a Pensioner Concession Card; or
- an eligible beneficiary of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card; or
- 2. a temporary foster carer; or
- 3. the parent/carer of a student who is 16 years or older and who holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card or Disability Support Pension Card).

The parent/carer must submit an application to the school prior to the end of Term 2.

Provided the above conditions are satisfied, the amount payable is:

• \$225 for secondary school students.

If you have already applied for this earlier, you do not need to do anything as you have already received your CSEF; however for those that may now be eligible please contact the school to get your application form in or use the link below before the end of Term 2.
