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Message from our Campus Principal



The last few weeks have been jam-packed with great things across our Campus and it is fantastic to see such a positive buzz around the place. This has been offset by some negative behaviours in the community by those who are not students of the Campus but with the support of Morwell Police, we are pleased to see this is dying down also. The safety of our students is our first priority.

The opening of our new administration building has alleviated a lot of strain on room availability in the school and this is expected to continue to improve with the arrival of a new portable classroom expected to take place in the next week or two, to be opened at the start of Term 2. This is recognition of the growth of the school; an additional class of students in Year 7 is a great thing allowing for more opportunities and flexibility to be available in the long term to provide more options for our students.

NAPLAN has kicked off last week and we are so proud of students for their efforts in this so far. With the introduction of NAPLAN Online, students are now able to space out their tests. Instead of four intensive days for all Year 7 and 9 students, ours will be undertaking a NAPLAN test every second day. This also provides lots more opportunities for catch up tests for those who are away and increases the likelihood of good quality assessments with students not worn out by the excessive testing regime.

NAPLAN is important to our school and provides valuable data about the positives of our teaching, as well as highlighting gaps that we are not reaching, or areas that will need additional focus for our Year 7s as they move through high school. Although it receives

negative media attention every time it is on, in our eyes NAPLAN is a positive opportunity as long as it is used correctly.



I was really proud to join with Ms Wenjing Sun in taking a group of four students to Melbourne on Saturday last week to take their HSK Level 1 Chinese test. This is an adult assessment and a credit to the students for taking the time, particularly on the weekend, to have a go. The other people taking the test were university students. They won't know for a month or so if they've passed but they came out feeling very confident. This was the first time we've had students take the HSK test and I look forward to more opportunities in the future. It was also a fantastic opportunity to experience some of the facilities

of university and the students were a little awe-struck at the quality and size of the Victoria University City Campus building.

We finish the end of term with our Parent Teacher Conversations and I want to encourage all parents to attend these with their child. Involving the student is an important part of the conversation that allows them to take ownership for their success and be part of the solution for any problems that have arisen. For Year 7 students in particular, this is a change to their experience of primary school where often they are talked *about* rather than *with*. It is best to book in appointments online by using Compass. You will be notified when these open and if you have any difficulties, please don't hesitate to contact our very helpful office staff. Thursday 6th April we will not have any classes running to enable families to come in during the day time. Our last day of classes, Wednesday 5th April, is a full day with the usual 2:50pm finish.

As this will be the last newsletter before the holidays, I wish you all a happy Easter and a restful break. The first day back for the term is a student free day for professional learning and the second day back is ANZAC Day so students return on Wednesday, 26th April.

The excursion focused on the students learning about how the world of work is changing and the skills that will be most

important for them as they move into the workforce. Students will then rotated through three activities which will expose them to industry changing technologies and new ways of problem solving.

Year 7 Camp





Year 9 Camp

The 2023 Year 9 Camp planning is underway and permission forms will be sent out soon. This camp will be capped at 60 students due to accommodation and activity factors. If more than 60 students return permission forms attendance and behaviour data will be used to select places. The Melbourne Discovery Camp will be via DOXA Youth Foundation and will cost \$150 per student.

Morrisby Interviews

In week two and three of Term 2, Year 9 students get the incredible opportunity to complete a Morrisby profiling session.

My Career Insights (Morrisby) is a program for all Year 9 students in government secondary schools. This program will help your Year 9 child to:

- Learn about what skills and abilities they could bring to a job.
- Find out about what jobs match their abilities, interests and personality, and the subjects they need for those jobs.

As part of the program, your child will:

- Complete a series of online questions and quizzes (on the Morrisby Profile website) at school.
- Receive a Morrisby Profile Report showing the results from the questions and quizzes, and possible jobs that match their abilities, interests, and personality.
- Have a 30-minute meeting with a Morrisby-trained Career Practitioner, who will explain the report to your child.

A huge thank you to all the staff and students from Kurnai College for their efforts and to the Health and Physical Education staff for their professional running of the day.








Important School Information

CSEF

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like:

- school camps or trips
- swimming and schoolorganised sports programs
- outdoor education programs
- · excursions and incursions.

From 2020, the Victorian Government is investing an additional \$160.9 million for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund over the next four years. This funding will help ensure more than 220,000 government and non-government students from lower-



income families can participate in camps, sports and excursions each year.



Code Red Fire Danger

A reminder to all families, that on days of **Code Red** in the West & South Gippsland Fire Zone, all campuses will be closed.


This is a change to previous years, and we ask families to be aware of this in preparation to when Summer returns.



Bushfire Preparedness

Schools on the Bushfire At-Risk Register and Schools at Risk of Grassfire (Category 4)

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.



Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) and those at risk of grassfire (Category 4) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day (Catastrophic) is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. **Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire or grassfire risk.**

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by Compass or SMS. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day (Catastrophic) we will

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day (Catastrophic).
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.
- All bus routes that travel through the Code Red area will be cancelled.
- Depending on which Bureau of Meteorology district is impacted bus route cancellations may affect our school.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan, re-prioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters.

What can parents do?

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone
 numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by checking our website
 kurnai.co and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching
 staff about our emergency management plan.
- Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.


